



SAN PEDRO DE ATACAMA





CEJAR LAGOON: (cod.SPABTO1): The Atacama Salt Flat is Chile's largest salt deposit, receiving water from the San Pedro River and mountain streams. Inside, the turquoise Cejar Lagoon offers a unique floating experience due to its high salt content. Next, we visit Ojos del Salar, two water pools fed by underground springs. Finally, at Tebenquiche Lagoon, the evaporating water forms salt crusts that reflect the Andes. The tour ends with a snack in the desert.

MOON VALLEY: (cod.SPABTO2): It's a desert landscape and a geomorphological wonder. Once called Las Salinas by our ancestors, it's now known worldwide as the Valley of the Moon, named for its moon-like terrain. Declared a Nature Sanctuary in 1982 and part of the Los Flamencos National Reserve, it offers stunning geological views, especially at sunrise and sunset.

Highlights include Quebrada de Ckari, the natural formation Las Tres Marías, the majestic Duna Mayor, and viewpoints like Quebrada Honda, home to the famous Piedra del Coyote.

PURITAMA HOTSPRINGS: (*cod.SPABT03*): Puritama (from Kunza Puri-Agua, Tama-Caliente). Located in a large stone ravine, the area is designed for family relaxation, featuring a set of 8 warm water pools with temperatures ranging from 25 to 30°C. The water has medicinal and therapeutic properties due to the minerals brought by the Puritama River.

This marvel is a natural exception in the midst of the desert.



RAINBOW VALLEY: (cod.SPABTO4): This magical place was formed by tectonic movements combined with volcanic activity millions of years ago, at the meeting point of the Domeyko Mountain Range, the Salt Mountain Range, and the Andes. Its name comes from the wide variety of colors visible in the hills of the valley, which reflect the richness and different concentrations of clays, salts, and minerals. These rocks are heavily weathered due to the environment and climatic conditions.

This expedition will also allow us to visit the Hierbas Buenas petroglyphs, of great historical importance, based on rock art where the Atacameño people left a trace of their culture (a place with significant geological content).



RED STONES: (*cod.SPABT05*): On this expedition, we will visit Toconao, a village known for its simplicity, calmness, and unique climate. We'll explore Laguna Chaxa in the Los Flamencos National Reserve, and the highland village of Socaire, where we'll see the church and learn about local agriculture. We'll also visit the Lagunas Miscanti and Meñiques, located at 4,200 meters in the reserve, surrounded by volcanoes and rich in wildlife. Finally, we'll go to Piedras Rojas, famous for its naturally red rocks.

GEYSERS DEL TATIO: (cod.SPABTO6): El Tatio (from Kunza "tata-iu," meaning "The Grandfather Who Cries") is one of the highest geyser fields in the world (temperatures range from -5°C to -20°C). Located in the Andes northeast of San Pedro de Atacama, it is the largest geyser field in the Southern Hemisphere and the third largest in the world, after Yellowstone (USA) and Dolina Giezerow (Russia). The most intense fumaroles occur between 6:00 and 7:00 a.m., with temperatures reaching up to 85°C. On the way back, you may see wildlife such as vicuñas, llamas, rheas, and vizcachas, while the flora features giant cacti, llaretas, and coirón. We will also visit the small ancestral village of Machuca, where the few inhabitants are mainly engaged in sheep herding and cheese production. Nearby is Laguna Salada, home to families of flamingos, ducks, and seagulls, set against a stunning landscape.

HIGHLANDS LAGOONS: (cod.SPABTO7): On this expedition, we will visit Toconao, known for its simplicity and crafts, and explore Laguna Chaxa in the Los Flamencos National Reserve. We will then travel to the highland village of Socaire to see the church and local agriculture. At around 4,200 meters above sea level, we will visit Lagunas Miscanti and Meñiques, noted for their volcanoes and diverse wildlife, including flamingos and various bird species, as well as Llareta and Paja Brava plants.



ARCHAEOLOGICAL TOUR: (cod.SPABTO8): At Bercovich Travels, we are committed to showcasing and teaching our history. We believe that before embarking on the various excursions or landscapes we offer, it is essential to start with our ancestors. This excursion takes you back in time to their era and connects you to the origins of the Atacameña Culture, visiting some of their archaeological sites rich in history, such as the Tulor Village and the Pucara de Quitor.

Tulor Village: One of the oldest sites chronologically, dating back to the first settlements in the Atacama Salt Flat basin, which can be visited, as there are older ones that are not accessible. Tulor has been preserved for centuries under the sand. Pucara de Quitor: An indigenous fortress, with one theory suggesting it was built due to internal conflicts among communities following the decline of the Tiwanaku Culture. It later became known for being one of the first sites of conflict between Spaniards and indigenous people.





THE RESCUE OF THE SAN JOSE MINE (*cod.COPBT01*): On August 5, 2010, a collapse at the San José Mine near Copiapó left 33 miners trapped over 700 meters underground. During this tour, we will visit a dune area and, together with one of the rescued miners, visit the mine where, after nearly 70 days, a group of men emerged victorious from the depths of the earth.

Departure and Arrival: Copiapó (to be arranged).



ASTRONOMICAL CAMPFIRE (*cod.COPBT02*): The clearest and most transparent skies in Chile and the world are found in northern Chile. By a small campfire in the desert, alongside amateur astronomers and their manual telescopes, you'll have the chance to learn about our galaxy, its planets, and the universe in general. It's a unique experience in one of the best places for astronomical observation in Chile.



CHORRILO CLIFFS AND BAHIA INGLESA (cod.COPBTO3): We will visit the port of Caldera and its Estación Cultural Center, which houses one of the most important fossil collections in South America. Later, we'll enjoy coastal cuisine in Bahía Inglesa before heading to the Protected Area of Isla Grande de Atacama in the Aguada de Chorrillos sector (photo), where we'll walk along its cliffs and beach, concluding with birdwatching at the Copiapó River Wetland.



CACTI IN PAN DE AZUCAR NATIONAL PARK (cod.COPBTO4): On a journey through the coastal desert of Atacama, we will visit Pan de Azúcar National Park, where the Camanchaca fog nourishes the abundant desert flora and fauna. We will stop by the Environmental Information Center (photo) and the CONAF Atacama cactus garden, where you'll learn about many unique cactus species native to the area. Afterward, we'll enjoy a traditional lunch at Caleta Pan de Azúcar. The tour will conclude with a 5km hike in the El Mirador sector, where we will observe cacti, shrubs, foxes, guanacos, and various birds.








CITY TOUR VALPARAISO - VIÑA DEL MAR (cod.VALBTO1): Visit the city of Viña del Mar, known as "The Garden City," exploring its main tourist attractions (Quinta Vergara, Flower Clock, Casino, among others). The tour then continues to Valparaíso, where you'll fall in love with this city declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We will ride some of its funiculars, exploring Alegre and Concepción Hills, along with the Atkinson, Gervasoni, and 21 de Mayo promenades, ending at the famous Plaza Sotomayor.

WALKING TOUR VALPARAISO (cod.VALBTO2): We leave the hotel for a 3 to 4-hour tour of Valparaíso, suitable for all ages as it's calm and easygoing. The tour begins at Plaza de La Victoria, with its Brazilian trees, located in front of the Santiago Severin library, the naval club, and Valparaíso Cathedral, where the Edwards Palace once stood before the 1906 earthquake. From there, we'll take a local trolley to Plaza Aníbal Pinto, one of the city's main hubs, and then ride the historic Reina Victoria funicular.

This first stop offers great views of the city, just steps from Dimalow Passage, where we'll see a Lutheran church on Concepción Hill. As we walk, we'll pass landmarks like "El Desayuno" restaurant, the 19th-century Anglican church, and more. You'll see the unique topography of Valparaíso's hills and winding passages.

Next, we'll visit Paseo Atkinson, where you'll be charmed by the colorful houses, restaurants, and schools. From here, we can see graffiti dedicated to Pablo Neruda. We'll then head to Gervasoni Passage, an iconic city spot, and take the oldest funicular, from 1883, to Prat Street, the city's bustling area. We continue to Plaza Sotomayor, the heart of Valparaíso.

Here, you'll notice the Naval Building, Victoria Hotel, the Faculty of Arts and Culture, Germania Fire Station, and the port entrance. Most importantly, you'll see the monument to the heroes of the Naval Battle of Iquique. Our final stop is Paseo Yugoslavo, reached on foot from Plaza Sotomayor after taking the El Peral funicular.



VALPARAISO AND ITS GRAFFITIS (cod.VALBTO3): We start the tour in Barrio Puerto, exploring Echaurren, Sotomayor, and Wheelwright squares, as well as La Matriz Church and Puerto Market. This area is home to murals by renowned Chilean graffiti artists such as Cekis, Hes, Saile, and the Ha Crew, who have shaped Chilean muralism history.


Next, we head up to Aníbal Pinto Square, a bohemian spot filled with ever-changing murals, featuring works by artists like Aislap, El Odio, and Dana Pink. From here, we'll explore the Cerro Alegre and Cerro Concepción neighborhoods, known for their charming streets adorned with colorful murals. Here, we'll see works by artists like INTI Castro, La Robot de Madera, and Charquipunk, among others. The tour includes a visit to Paseo Yugoslavo, famous for its panoramic view and steps lined with urban art.

We continue towards Cerro La Cruz, a key area in the Valparaíso en Colores project, where local and international artists have revitalized the neighborhood with murals.

From here, we'll arrive at Cerro Cárcel, home to the former Valparaíso prison, now a cultural center. In this neighborhood, you'll find stunning murals by artists such as Dasic Fernández, Belgian artist Roa, and the Brazilian duo Pam and Tikka.

Finally, we'll visit the iconic Cerro Polanco, one of the most authentic areas of Valparaíso. Though this neighborhood was not originally part of the tourist circuit, a 2012 international graffiti festival transformed it into a giant canvas. The apartment blocks and streets of the hill are now covered in vibrant murals, showcasing the work of collectives like Crazys Crew and other international artists.




ISLA NEGRA, TUNQUEN AND QUINTAY (cod.VALBTO5): Departure from the hotel at the agreed time towards Isla Negra, located in the Province of San Antonio. After a 30-minute drive, we will reach the coast, passing through various beach resorts like Algarrobo and the picturesque fishing village of Quisco, until arriving at Isla Negra to visit the house museum where the famous poet Pablo Neruda (Nobel Prize for Literature 1971) lived. This house offers a privileged view and houses extensive collections of objects that the poet gathered throughout his life. Our return will follow an alternative route where we will visit the Tunquén beach resort and the Quintay cove, which once operated as a whaling station and now features a museum and various seaside restaurants.





FULL DAY NORTHERN BEACHES (cod.VALBTO5): The tour begins at your hotel, heading 70 km north of Viña del Mar to the seaside resort of Maitencillo, where we will walk along its beaches and admire its varied architecture. We then continue to the exclusive resorts of Cachagua and Zapallar, known for their Mediterranean and modern architecture, as well as their beautiful fishing cove and rocky coastline. At 1:00 pm, lunch is at the passengers' expense. Afterwards, we will visit the park cemetery with its imposing sea cliffs.




HALF DAY CITY TOUR TEMUCO (cod.TEMBTO1): This tour offers insights into the former Kingdom of Araucanía and its regional capital, Temuco, a name that means "water of the temu tree" (a medicinal plant) in the Mapudungun language. We will visit traditional locations such as Cerro Ñielol, where archaeological finds like ceramics and funerary urns of the Mapuche people have been discovered. A significant historical-cultural landmark here is "La Patagua del Armisticio," a symbolic tree commemorating the peace agreement between Chileans and Mapuches during the Conquest and Pacification of Araucanía and its integration into the Republic of Chile. This site was a refuge and stronghold of Mapuche resistance.

In this historic tour, we will visit the Regional Museum of Araucanía, which preserves the cultural heritage of the region. The museum features exhibits such as the park and its photographic displays, the history of the Thiers House, and the "Dreams of the Rütrafe" collection of Mapuche silverwork. Exhibits span from hunter-gatherer societies to European settlers, among others. Inside, we will also visit the regional crafts store of Fundación Chol-Chol, which promotes the concept of "fair trade Mapuche." This cultural journey provides a comprehensive overview of the region's history before returning to the hotel.



HALF DAY CITY TOUR PUCON (cod.PUCBTO1): Departure from the hotel at the agreed time to begin the tour of the resort town of Pucón, visiting key points of interest that reflect the cultural life and self-sufficiency of the locals. We will start by visiting traditional wood crafts and flowers, where we will take part in their production. Then, we will circle around Lake Villarrica with a short stop at the pier, continuing our tour along the main streets such as Pedro de Valdivia and Miguel Ansorena, leading us directly to the Franciscan Monastery of the Poor Clares of Pucón. Built in 1956, it is situated in a special location on a small hill, offering the best view of the city of Pucón. We will return to the city, heading straight to the commercial and gastronomic center through O'Higgins and Fresia streets, where we will find excellent restaurants and buildings constructed from native wood. We will also see the main square, known for its green spaces, wooden sculptures, and tree species that add a unique touch to the surroundings. The tour will continue across the hanging bridge in the Quelhue area, located over the famous Trancura River, before returning to the hotel.



CITY TOUR PUCON - VILLARRICA(cod.PUCBT02): On this visit, we will uncover the most significant secrets of the cultural history of Pucón and Villarrica, now two of the most important tourist centers in our country. In Villarrica, located 26 km from Pucón, we will visit the Museo de la Universidad Católica de Villarrica to see a collection of traditional and pre-Hispanic instruments, as well as a significant historical exhibit about the city. We will also visit the Catholic Cathedral and the beautiful promenade on the west side of Lake Villarrica, and explore the city's viewpoint and commercial center. Villarrica is known for its craftsmanship in wood, stone, and textiles, which can be appreciated at the Fritz Artisan Market and local crafts, where we will find a typical Mapuche Ruka (a traditional straw house). After visiting Villarrica, we will continue to Pucón, located at the foot of the majestic Villarrica Volcano, to visit the famous Playa Grande, where we can enjoy views of the tranquil Lake Villarrica. We will also visit La Poza, an old beach where timber was once collected to be transported by steamships to Villarrica in the 1800s. Today, La Poza is a wonderful spot with a privileged view of the majestic Villarrica Volcano and its surroundings, where we can enjoy its tranquility, silence, and lush natural greenery while spotting local bird species. We will continue with a visit to the famous wooden flower crafts, where we can learn about their unique production and, if desired, participate in their handmade creation. Finally, we will head to the Monasterio de las Monjas Clarisas viewpoint for panoramic views of Pucón. We will then visit the city's main square to see its ancient trees and explore the heart of this important southern Chilean town. The tour ends with a return to your hotel in Pucón.



CULTURAL TOUR TEMUCO WITH LUNCH(cod.TEMBTO2): Departure from Pucón to the capital city of the Araucanía region, Temuco, located 110 km away. The name Temuco, in the Mapudungun language, means "water of the temu" (medicinal tree). This excursion focuses on the city's history, the Mapuche influence, and the early years of our Nobel Prize winner Pablo Neruda. Upon arrival in Temuco, the tour will start at the Cerro Ñielol natural reserve, a significant site in Chile's history and the region, where the peace agreement between the Mapuche people and the Chilean army was signed, marking the beginning of the pacification of Araucanía. We will then proceed to the city center, where we will visit the historic Municipal Market, an important tourist and commercial hub featuring a typical display of local crafts. After exploring the market, passengers will enjoy lunch at a typical local restaurant. HD HORSEBACK RIDING AT HUEPIL MALAL OR ANTILCO EQUESTRIAN CENTER (cod.PUCBTO3): Departure at the agreed time for an exciting horseback ride through the enchanting landscapes surrounding Pucón. Passengers will head to the Huepil or Antilco area, 27 kilometers from Pucón, via a beautiful rural road typical of southern Chile. At the equestrian center, horseback rides can last from three hours to several days, depending on the request. An experienced rider with many years of training will accompany us on this incredible adventure. No advanced riding skills are required; just trust the guide and the horse, both very familiar with the local winter and summer trails. After being equipped with all the necessary gear, passengers will embark on a visual journey through the breathtaking volcanic mountain range of the Araucanía. Along the way, riders will be treated to stunning views of the majestic Pehuenche landscapes, gentle hills covered with crops, dormant volcanic craters, and dense forests beneath a perfect sky. The scene is completed by tree branches, fallen trunks, and small red fruits like wild roses. To conclude the ride, the guide and rider traditionally offer a delightful combination of Chilean red wine and Spanish chorizo, sharing stories about life and horses. The horseback ride lasts about two and a half to three hours. After this adventure, we will return to the hotel in Pucón.



Afterward, we continue toward the center of the touristic city of Pucón. The city's renowned beauty will be highlighted with a visit to traditional wooden flower crafts, where we will participate in their fascinating creation. We will also visit the pier, the Poza of Pucón, the main street O'Higgins, and Fresia Street, known for its excellent restaurants and the charming Plaza de Armas, among other city highlights. Return to the hotel.



We continue to the Ojos and Lake Caburgua, a lake of entirely volcanic origin, with a walk around the waterfalls offering a stunning view of the Blue Lagoon. We return to Pucón along a trail that follows the Liucura River, providing a breathtaking view of the Quetrupillán, Villarrica, and Lanín volcanoes. Finally, we reach the "La Pasarela de Quelhue" area, a suspension bridge crossing the Trancura River, before arriving back in Pucón.




FD TREKKING HUERQUEHUE NATIONAL PARK PUCON WITH LUNCH (cod.PUCBT06):

Departing from the hotel, head 33 km east of Pucón to reach Huerquehue National Park, which spans 12,500 hectares. This mountainous area is known for its moderate slopes and stunning beauty, featuring ravines, hills, and forests of Araucaria and Lenga trees, among others. The park is home to unique wildlife such as Darwin's frog, the culpeo fox, and the Chilean condor in its higher elevations. Huerquehue is famed for its extensive network of trails, making it a favorite for nature lovers and trekking enthusiasts. Trails include Los Lagos (8.8 km, 7 hours round trip), Quinchol (5 km, 4 hours round trip), Los Huerquenes (20.7 km, 2 days), San Sebastián (8 km, 10 hours round trip), and Ñirrico (0.8 km, 1 hour round trip). The park is part of the Andean-Patagonian Forests Region and is located within the Araucanía Mountain Range. The main watercourses in the park include the Renahue, Blanco, and Quinchol rivers, as well as numerous smaller streams with permanent flow. There are 20 lagoons, most of which cover less than 7.5 hectares, with the most notable being Lake Toro (27.5 ha), Lake Verde (32.5 ha), and lagoons such as Chica, Los Patos, Huerquehue, Escondida, Seca, Clara, Las Avutardas, Angelina, and Los Cóndores. These water bodies are part of the Toltén River watershed. The Araucaria tree, an essential species in the park, has great ethnobotanical significance, historically serving as a food source (piñón seed) for the Pehuenche people. Archaeological findings, such as pottery remains and rock shelters, indicate occasional human occupation in the park.



HD BASE OF VILLARRICA VOLCANO AND SKI CENTER (cod.PUCBTO7): Villarrica National Park offers a stunning display of high mountain volcanic landscapes, with its most prominent feature being the majestic Villarrica Volcano dominating the scenery. The park is known for its variety of native forests, lava fields, valleys, lakes, lagoons, diverse native wildlife, and the rugged topography typical of the Andes, featuring high peaks and steep ravines. The park includes three volcanoes: Villarrica (2,847 m), Quetrupillán (2,360 m), and Lanín (3,746 m), which attract climbers alongside its forests and glaciers. Departing from the hotel, the tour takes you to one of the park's entrances, leading to the base of Villarrica Volcano. From here, you'll enjoy views of the surrounding lakes and volcanoes. After a short walk along a lava trail, the transfer will take you to the ski center's café, where you can explore this beautiful area.



The park is a fusion of the former Conguillio and Los Paraguas parks, known for their shared ecological and geographical features. Conguillio is famous for its extensive native forests, particularly the araucaria trees, crystal-clear lagoons, and the magnificent Llaima Volcano. Highlights include the Lago Conguillio, nestled at the foot of Sierra Nevada and surrounded by lush vegetation, as well as other natural attractions like the Verde, Arco Iris, and Captrén lagoons, Truful-Truful Falls, and Sierra Nevada's hiking trail with panoramic views of the volcano and glaciers.

The park is rich in biodiversity, with wildlife such as the monito del monte (the world's smallest marsupial), condors, and various aquatic birds. Several trails allow visitors to explore the park's geological and ecological wonders, such as "Sierra Nevada," "Los Carpinteros" (through araucaria and lenga forests), and "Cañadón del Truful-Truful," revealing the area's volcanic history. This tour offers one of the most impressive combinations of nature in Chile, with the unique lava flows of Llaima Volcano being a particular highlight.

Our destination is Nahuelbuta National Park, 35 km northwest of Angol, situated in the highest part of the Nahuelbuta mountain range at altitudes between 950 to 1,565 meters above sea level. The park's landscape is dominated by impressive araucaria forests, accompanied by other significant species such as coigüe, lenga, and raulí. In the park's higher areas, you can find Ñire and coirón trees.

The park's highest peaks include Anay, Piedra del Águila, and Alto Nahuelbuta, reaching 1,450, 1,460, and 1,565 meters respectively. Notable scenic areas include Pehuenco, a small valley with crystal-clear streams surrounded by araucaria, oak, and coigüe forests; Piedra del Águila, a natural lookout offering panoramic views; Coimallín with its untouched landscapes; and Las Turberas, known for its insectivorous plants. There are two main hiking trails: Piedra del Águila, offering views from the Andes to the Pacific Ocean on clear days, and Cerro Anay, showcasing beautiful vegetational communities and lush green landscapes.

After this enchanting encounter with nature, we return to our hotel in Temuco.



We will also learn about their customs, music, and unique worldview, from a people of warriors and farmers with over 12,000 years of history. After this enjoyable cultural activity, we will return to the town of Pucón.

Lake Budi is situated in the communes of Puerto Saavedra and Puerto Domínguez, towards the coast of the Araucanía region, an area predominantly developed by the Mapuche people. In this region, the indigenous Mapuche communities preserve their native language, Mapudungun, along with their cultural traditions and their traditional houses called "Rukas," which are primarily built from wood and straw. In this unique place, visitors will be able to share in the daily tasks and customs of the Mapuche people, and taste their distinctive cuisine, which is based on the fruits of the land and their particular worldview. After enjoying a typical Mapuche lunch, passengers will return to Pucón, but not before stopping to visit Carahue, a picturesque town on the banks of the Imperial River, which was once the navigational route of the Mapuches and their canoes, and is also a typical area for cultivating the famous "Caraguina" potato, known throughout the country. After this visit, we will return to Pucón.

RAFTING RÍO TRANCURA BAJO / (BTAV 02) RAFTING RÍO TRANCURA ALTO

This thrilling activity guarantees excitement, as participants will safely descend the river on a raft through rapids classified as levels 3 and 4. Special water suits and certified safety equipment are provided, significantly reducing the risk of this sport. We will navigate through the well-known rapids of the Trancura River, learning about river navigation after receiving prior instruction to ensure a fun and safe experience while understanding the difficulty levels we will face.


H/D CANOPY (cod ADVBTO2): This fun activity takes place on a course located 10 km from Pucón, on the road to Caburgua, in the Metreñehue area. The course lasts 1.5 hours and is set on an island formed by the Trancura River, surrounded by oak, coigüe, ulmo, and copihue trees. The circuit covers 2,000 meters of steel cable, specially designed and imported for this sport, along with all the technical elements used. It includes 11 lines ranging from 40 to 240 meters in length, with maximum heights of up to 25 meters, and speeds reaching between 20 and 45 km/h. At each platform, participants are properly secured, and every time they move from one platform to another, a safety rope is used. This exciting activity is offered at three different times and can take place in sun, rain, or snow, which only enhances the fun. Before starting, participants receive thorough safety instructions and are provided with all necessary safety gear, such as helmets, harnesses, carabiners, and high-quality double ropes. Expert guides ensure an unforgettable experience in a completely natural setting. After the activity, participants return to Pucón.

F/D ASCENTO TO VILLARRICA VOLCANO (cod ADVBTO3): We depart from our hotel early in the morning and head to Villarrica Volcano, or Ruca Pillan, which in the Mapuche language means "House of the Devil." This active volcano is one of the most important and imposing in the Araucanía Region, standing at 2,847 meters tall. It is also one of the most active volcanoes in South America. The view from its summit is breathtaking, offering vistas of the Villarrica, Calafquén, Huelipilum, Pellaifa, and Caburgua lakes, as well as other volcanoes like Lanín, Lonquimay, Quetrupillán, Choshuenco, and Llaima. Safety is a key aspect of this major excursion, which is guided by experts and includes all necessary equipment. The excursion lasts approximately nine hours, as the ascent to the summit is gradual, making it accessible to visitors with minimal physical fitness who want to experience reaching the top of one of the most important active volcanoes in the world. After this amazing adventure, we return to Pucón.



PUCON / SAN MARTIN DE LOS ANDES VIA PUERTO FUY (cod BINBTO1): Departure to the Andean town of Panguipulli, located 80 km from Pucón, passing through Neltume, 8 km from Puerto Fuy (a small settlement by Lake Pirehuico). Here, board the Hua Hum ferry for a scenic 1.5 to 1.75-hour navigation across Lake Pirehuico, ending at Puerto Pirehuico. After disembarking, travel 11 km on a gravel road to the Chilean customs checkpoint, followed by another 13 km to the Argentine customs control. The journey continues with a 42 km drive along Lake Lacar to the Argentine town of San Martín de los Andes. This picturesque route through Patagonian lakes features lush Valdivian rainforest, primarily of Raulí trees. At an altitude of 659 meters, this international pass is one of the lowest border crossings between Chile and Argentina, and it is commonly used in winter. The entire trip offers unique beauty, culminating in the arrival at the Andean town of San Martín de los Andes.



PUCON / SAN MARTIN DE LOS ANDES BY LAND (cod BINBTO2): Departure from Pucón to the border town of San Martín de los Andes, located 170 km away, via the international road Monseñor Valdez Subercaseaux. The journey first passes through the towns of Catripulli and Curarrehue before ascending the Andes to the Mamuil Malal border crossing, situated at the base of the Lanín Volcano and near the beautiful Laguna Quillelhue. After completing immigration procedures, continue through the heart of Lanín National Park to the town of Junín de los Andes. There are 40 km from Junín to San Martín, traveling through the typical Patagonian steppe. Arrival in San Martín de los Andes, Argentina.





PUCON / VILLA LA ANGOSTURA BY 7 LAKES CORRIDOR (cod BINBTO3): Departure from Pucón to the city of San Martín de los Andes, 170 km away. This extraordinary journey features a series of forests, lakes, mountains, and viewpoints, linking three protected areas: Lanín National Park, Nahuel Huapi National Park, and Los Arrayanes National Park. The route is renowned for its stunning natural beauty and is well worth exploring.

PUCON / BARILOCHE VIA 7 LAKES CORRIDOR (cod BINBTO4): Departure from Pucón to Argentina via the Mamuil Malal international pass, passing through the cities of Junín and San Martín de los Andes, then taking Route Seven Lakes or Route 234. This unique and scenic tourist route features not seven, but eight lakes along the way. The lakes, which can be seen throughout the journey, include Lago Lacar, Machónico, Falkner, Villarino, Escondido, Correntoso, Espejo, and Nahuel Huapi. The route runs directly between San Martín and Villa La Angostura, with Nahuel Huapi guiding the way to the final destination, the renowned tourist city of San Carlos de Bariloche. The distance from Pucón to Bariloche is 375 km. Note: In case of adverse weather conditions preventing travel via the Seven Lakes Corridor, the commercial route between San Martín de los Andes and Bariloche will be used.



F/D FULL DAY SAN MARTIN DE LOS ANDES (cod BINBTO5): Departure from Pucón to San Martín de los Andes (185 km) via the Mamuil Malal international pass, known as Tromen on the Argentine side. Along the way, you'll encounter various tourist attractions, such as the Río Turbio Volcanic Viewpoint, offering stunning views of the Villarrica, Lanín, and Quetrupillán volcanoes. The route passes through the Mapuche town of Curarrehue, leading to the beautiful Villarrica National Park. Crossing the historic Puesco International Pass, you'll come across the Momolluco Waterfall, also known as "Velo de la Novia," where the Trancura River originates. Continuing along, you'll see Laguna Quillelhue, known for its unique biodiversity, and a magnificent forest of ancient Araucaria trees, some between 1,500 and 3,500 years old. The majestic Lanín Volcano, standing at 3,500 meters, is also visible. After passing through customs, you'll reach the Cristo de la Concordia, symbolizing the union of Chile and Argentina as brother nations. The first Argentine town is Junín de los Andes, 40 km from San Martín. Once in San Martín, enjoy a short city tour, visiting the lakeside promenade of Lago Lacar and the city's main streets, known for their fine shops, restaurants, and beautiful chocolatiers. In the afternoon, return to Pucón.

H/D CITY TOUR VALDIVIA & NIEBLA (cod VALBTO3): Pickup at the hotel for this beautiful tour covering Valdivia's main attractions, including the traditional Feria Fluvial, where fishermen and farmers sell seafood and produce daily. It's also famous for the sea lions resting along the riverbank. We'll then visit Avenida Costanera, the Collico industrial district, the train station, General Lagos Street, the Valdivia locks, and the El Barro and El Canelo turrets, 18th-century fortresses built to protect the city from indigenous attacks, corsairs, and pirates. Crossing the Pedro de Valdivia Bridge, we'll visit the university, botanical garden, and Saval Park on Isla Teja, home to the famous Lotus Lagoon. The tour continues to the coastal town of Niebla, 17 km from the city center, where we'll explore the Castillo de la Pura y Limpia Concepción de Monfort de Lemus, featuring an on-site museum explaining the most important Spanish defensive system south of Callao.

F/D SAN RAMON PENINSULA (cod VALBTO4): This is one of the new destinations for passengers in Valdivia. After this enjoyable activity, we'll return to the hotel.

F/D TUMBA DEL BUEY GLACIER: (cod VALBTO9) :spans over 7,000 hectares, offering a diverse range of landscapes and experiences. This season, you and your family can enjoy views of lakes, valleys, and glaciers from Mocho Choshuenco. A 2-hour 4x4 drive from Panguipulli will take you to the ranger station, followed by a hike to La Tumba del Buey, a small volcanic crater that recalls the violent eruption of the now-dormant Mocho Choshuenco volcano. The trails are suitable for all family members, as they do not present significant physical or technical challenges. Trails include:

- Afquintue Trail: 700 meters long, taking about 30 minutes to walk from the vehicle.
- Trail to Mirador Tumba del Buey: Various paths from the ranger station lead to a beautiful viewpoint over Panguipulli and Riñihue lakes, glaciers, and the Mocho Choshuenco volcanic complex. The hike is a bit over 3 km round-trip and takes about 90 minutes.






CITY TOUR AND BREWERY (cod COHBTO1): At the agreed time, departure from the hotel to begin the city tour of Coyhaique. This city was built in the middle of valleys with gentle slopes between the Simpson and Coyhaique rivers, with Cerro Divisadero visible to the south. We will start in the city's residential area and continue the tour towards Piedra del Indio, a rock formation that resembles the face of an indigenous person. We will then visit various points of interest in the city, such as the Pionero Square with its Shepherd Monument, and the Artisan Market, where handmade crafts from the entire region are showcased, located in front of the Plaza de Armas. Finally, we will make a brief stop at the D'Olbek Brewery, a local brewery founded by Belgian immigrant families. This excellent beer is made using high-quality European ingredients and the pure, crystal-clear water of Patagonia. We will tour the facilities and enjoy a small tasting. Once the city tour is complete, return to the hotel in Coyhaique.






H/D SIMPSON RIVER RESERVE AND VIRGIN WATERFALL (cod COHBTO2): At the agreed time, departure from the hotel towards the coast. Just 22 kilometers away lies the Simpson River Reserve. This national reserve is crossed by the Simpson River, ideal for adventure tourism, and its unique flora and fauna make it one of the most picturesque attractions due to its rugged geography and 40,542 hectares of protected land. The landscape, adorned with valleys, lush green areas, and the river flowing westward, combines with peaks over 1,500 meters high. The flora and fauna, including huemules, pumas, and other species, coexist with the uneven terrain, plains, waterfalls, and cascades, the most notable being the Velo de la Novia. Along the way, we will stop to admire the beautiful Virgin Waterfall.





AIKEN PARK FULL DAY (cod COHBTO3): Aikén del Sur Park is a private park on the Austral Highway and is part of one of the coldest rainforests in the world. It is located in Puerto Chacabuco, 80 kilometers from the city of Coyhaique. This eco-tourism reserve was created to protect the wild flora and fauna. It covers over 250 hectares with trails and routes to experience the great natural diversity of Chilean Patagonia. The park features vast forests and meltwaters that form channels and rivers. Many tourists come to this place to appreciate the vegetation, while others seek climbing routes and rocks to practice this sport.




QUEULAT NATIONAL PARK (cod COHBTO4): Departure from Coyhaique towards the Northern Austral Highway, specifically to Queulat Park and its main attraction, the Hanging Glacier. Along the way, inside the park, we will hike part of the trails in the Enchanted Forest and enter the evergreen forest to admire the Father García Waterfall. By mid-afternoon, we will arrive at the Puyuhuapi Fjord, one of the arms of the Pacific Ocean that extends into the Patagonian Andes, where the Hanging Glacier will gradually come into view. Here, we will take the lagoon trail to get an even closer look at the unique features of this impressive glacier. Then, we will continue our journey to the town of Puerto Puyuhuapi, a beautiful small port village with colorful wooden houses and gardens, showcasing the history of German colonization. At sunset, we will return to Coyhaique.

MARBLE CHAPELS (cod COHBT05): Departure from Coyhaique along the Southern Austral Highway to General Carrera Lake, specifically to the town of Puerto Tranquilo. During the journey, we will enjoy a landscape dominated by lenga, coigüe, and ñire forests, vegetation that covers the entrance to the Cerro Castillo National Reserve, composed of forests and mountains, highlighted by the mountain of the same name (2,675 m high) and the Ibáñez River valley. Further along, we will see the emerald-green Laguna Verde, surrounded by jungle. We will cross the El Manso bridge and then observe the flooded valley covered in tall grasses and dead logs, remnants of the massive eruption of Hudson Volcano in 1991. Continuing on our way, we will enter the Portezuelo del Río Cajón (altitude 600 m). Here, the road begins to descend until we reach the town of Murta, located on a branch of General Carrera Lake. We will then continue along the shores of General Carrera Lake with its blue waters until we arrive at the town of Puerto Río Tranquilo. Here, we will take a boat ride to the stunning Marble Chapels Nature Sanctuary, a place of great scenic beauty, where the constant waves of the lake have eroded and polished the limestone, leaving behind beautiful caves with whimsical shapes and great appeal. At sunset, we will return to Coyhaique.




FD SAN RAFAEL LAGOON (cod COHBTO6): This unforgettable excursion will take place aboard a modern catamaran equipped with all the comforts to make this journey a pleasant memory. We will sail 125 nautical miles through Patagonian channels, green islands, and fjords with lush nature before entering the San Rafael Lagoon National Park, declared a World Biosphere Reserve. Upon entering San Rafael Lagoon, we will see icebergs floating on the water, and as we approach the glacier, we will hear the thunderous calving of ice thousands of years old. Aboard zodiac boats, we will get even closer to the San Rafael Glacier and the numerous icebergs with attractive shapes and beautiful colors. At the end of the zodiac excursion, we will enjoy an exquisite whiskey or pisco with ancient ice and begin our return to Puerto Chacabuco.








This place has 242,242 hectares and was declared a World Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO in 1978. During the trip you will be able to cross part of its territory and observe the impressive Andean massif, whose summits impact all those who visit it. This place is surrounded by glaciers like the Grey, waterfalls, lagoons and lakes like the Pehoé, which together with its varied flora and fauna make this place one of the best known in the world. the most known in the world for its richness and natural beauty. Time is set aside for lunch. On the way back to Puerto Natales, the second important stop is made: the Milodon Cave, a Natural Monument where remains of the prehistoric animal were found. We will visit this place and then return to Puerto Natales.
